## E-12 Differences at a Glance

Updated: April 26, 2019

### HOUSE (HF 2400)

### Funding: \$900 million

- Basic Formula Allowance 3% in FY '20 to \$6,501 and 2% in FY '21 to \$6,631
- \$120 million for SPED to "freeze" cross subsidy
- Continues 4,000 School Readiness and Voluntary Pre-K seats
- Increases Tier 2 Operating Referendum equalization from \$510,000 per RPU to \$650,000 per RPU
- Increases Safe Schools aid and levies to \$45 per pupil in FY '20 and \$54 in FY '21
- Starts another round of support staff, 6-year declining grants for \$10 million a year
- Funds new "breakfast after the bell' program for \$4.3 million in '20 and \$5.8 million '21
- Funds recruiting and retaining teachers of color \$3 million in FY '20 and \$4 million in FY '21
- Many grants extended or begun

# SENATE (SF7)

### Funding: \$206 million

- Basic Formula Allowance: ½% in FY '20 to \$6,343 and ½% in FY '21 to \$6,375
- \$38 per pupil increase in Safe Schools aid for FY '20 and '21 only
- \$0 above forecasted amounts for SPED
- Many grants, some discontinuation

#### Taxes & Broadband

- Raises \$1.2 billion primarily on corporate federal tax conformity and foreign earnings
- Repeals transfers from General Fund to Highway fund, \$230 million annually
- Adds \$0.20 to gas tax over two years
- Increases Ag Bond Credit to 70%
- -\$30 million in FY '21, \$81 m in '22 & '23
- \$70 million for broadband
- Paid FMLA with 0.65% payroll tax

#### Taxes & Broadband

- No changes to transportation
- Raises net \$0 new revenue in Federal Tax Conformity
- Increases Operating Referendum Revenue Tier 1 to \$900,000, Tier 2 to \$550,000 and Tier 3 to \$440,000
- \$30 million for broadband
